PLEASE REVIEW THE LAUNCH PROCEDURES BEFORE YOUR DUTY DAY!

Every flying member (except tow pilots and instructors on a regular teaching schedule) is on the schedule for line duty. If you are either a pre-solo student or have never performed this duty, Joshua will pair you with someone who has experience. Please check this list carefully to see when you're on duty and if you're working with someone. Reach out to Joshua if you feel you need to be paired with someone for more training. Be sure to go to the calendar page on the website and put yourself down in the Line Volunteer column for the day you're assigned.

Remember, if you can't make your duty assignment, you must find a replacement. Once that is done, contact <u>Joshua Abbe</u> and let him know so he is aware of the change. Include <u>Mark Palmer</u> so he can get it in *Airworthy*!

If you see VOLUNTEERS NEEDED listed on the schedule, this indicates that no one is scheduled for that day and that volunteers are appreciated. Please contact Joshua if you are available.

THE FLIGHT'S NOT OVER UNTIL THE AIRCRAFT IS SECURED AND THE JOTFORM SUBMITTED!

FRIENDLY REMINDER: STOP BEFORE THE DROP!

During the landing roll, assure that the glider's wing does not drop into the soft shoulders along the new runway. Offset your rollout to one side so you can drop the wingtip wheel or skid on the pavement. And, "Stop before the drop!"

HANGAR DOORS by Becky Kinder

In addition to keeping our planes in excellent shape, **Doug Curry** also knows our hangar doors as well as anyone. He and **Dave Rolley** have each recently taken time to evaluate them. **Bill Gerblick** frequently lends an effective hand in the process, as he so often quietly does throughout our operations.

Maintaining these doors is almost an art because they were designed by Martin Marietta engineers in the '70's [or earlier –Ed.] using old airplane parts, stone knives, and bear skins.

If anything happens to them, replacement would **each** cost between \$20,000 and \$30,000. Cobbling something new together might be possible, but would likely involve massive efforts, considerable expense, and serious down time not of our choosing.

Several of our members have taken an interest in learning more about them and assisting in their maintenance. Thanks to **Tim** and **Levi Krantz** and **Mike Kinder** for stepping up, and to each of you who participate in their care!

DONATION FUNDS

We have two new donation funds active in the club. One fund is for the purchase, upgrade, and installation of a transponder in 840. We have been very fortunate to have been gifted a used Trig TT21 transponder by **Colin Mead**. Thank you Colin! We'll use donation funds to have it sent to Trig to be updated to TT22 standards (more power and compatible with ADS-B).

The second is a project for a movable port-apotty that can be stationed at the launch end of the runway. This is one of **Bill Gerblick's** pet projects.

You can donate to these funds directly through the new credit card portal. You can also choose to donate your unused A Rate funds to specific donation accounts.

AIRSPACE UPDATE by Mark Palmer

At the end of September, I was contacted by two members of Denver TRACON. They wanted to discuss airspace issues near Kelly. They were being proactive and wanted to give us a heads up on an increase in traffic into Centennial Airport (KAPA). Traffic into KAPA has increased 20% since pre-COVID levels. A large amount of that traffic is funneled in from the south and east through the DUNN arrival (see map below).

As you can see, the DUNN arrival runs south of us, then to the west, then turns north for the final approach into KAPA. I told our friends at TRACON that as VFR pilots, flying day VFR, we needed visual landmarks as references. They got the message.

The diagram above is courtesy of **Stan Bissell**, who overlaid the approach on a VFR chart. Check not only the location, but also the altitudes for each reporting point. TRACON came back to me with latitude and longitudes for all the reporting points. If you would like those coordinates to put in your computers, let me know and I will forward them to you.

TRACON wanted to emphasize that they haven't had any issue with gliders to date and no one has reported any conflicts. They just wanted us to be aware that we'll see more traffic.

Note that the DUNN arrival course from IMAGN to XPATH is very close to the course line from Perry Park to Calhan for Proving Ground Tasks 2 and 3! Also note that the turn north, from XPATH to XBEE is between us and Perry Park.
